

What Is The Great Commission?

We often hear the term 'The Great Commission' but do we know what it means? And how does it relate to my school and community?

- The Great Commission lifts up the Gospel of Jesus as the most important and powerful message in the world, the only eternal hope for mankind (Romans 1:16).
- The Great Commission reveals God's heart and love for every person from every family and race. God loved the world so much that He gave His only son (John 3:16).
- The Great Commission also means that everyone who receives Christ is to have the opportunity to grow and be equipped as a disciple and follower of Jesus (Matthew 28:19-20).
- The Great Commission is going to be completed. The Scriptures tells us that everyone is going to have the chance to hear and respond, and when that happens Christ will return (Matthew 24:14).
- Every Christian has the opportunity and responsibility to help in some way with THE Cause, the Great Commission. When we do, we discover our true purpose (2 Corinthians 5:19-20, Ephesians 2:10). It is at the heart of following Jesus Christ.

Praying for others, caring and sharing the Good News is the work of the Great Commission. Students on campus have an awesome opportunity to be involved. Adult leaders, educators and parents have a significant role through their prayer, leadership and influence.
